The Historical Society is looking for a home for bas relief items that are attached to children's buildings at the former Lakeville Hospital and were promised to them by National Development. Nursery tale items similar to the "Mayflower" in construction might go to Assawompset School and/or to our gazebo area garden. Consensus is that we

are open to such a donation depending on condition and size.

The Mary Fuller display case has materials about King Philip's Tavern, which will be the topic of the next booklet published by P.O.L.L.

Green Again 2010 will start this month with signups and garden choices. We will try for another dividing perennial day with Ted Dellarocco. Plans for the herb garden include eliminating the grass walkways, putting down weed block and stone or blue dust on top of it. We are also looking for a picnic table made of recycled materials with easy-to-access attached seating.

The Historical Commission would like to donate additional books to duplicate those in the past that were ordered for reference, and have them added to the circulating collection. This donation is supported.
