

Board of Health Meeting Minutes
September 22, 2011

The Lakeville Board of Health held a meeting on **September 22, 2011** in the Lakeville Town Office Building. Present at this meeting were Board Members Robert Poillucci, William E. Garvey and Terrence Flynn. Also present were Health Agent Lawrence Perry, Supervisor Nancy Teser and Board of Health Clerk Jo Lima as Recording Secretary.

Chairman Poillucci called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. He noted that this meeting was not being recorded.

Homeowners were not present for discussion. A memo was received by Inspector of Animals, Jared Darling in regards to a temporary stable permit approval. They will be utilizing their 12' X 40' detached garage as a temporary shelter for their four horses until a permanent stable is built. Currently there are three horses on the property and an inspection was done by Darling.

Upon motion made by Member Garvey and seconded by Member Flynn, the Board

VOTED: To approve the temporary stable permit. Unanimous vote in favor.

NEW BUSINESS:

A brief discussion was held in regards to the four or five day work week. Board of Selectmen Chairman Stephen Olivier was present. Member Garvey stated that in 15 years, he has never seen such poor morale with the employees in the town hall. He asked Board of Health employees if they had any complaints in regards to the four day work week. There were no comments made by employees. Member Garvey stated that happy employees are productive employees and he believes the hours should remain as they are. Chairman Poillucci disagreed. He would prefer a five day work week. He mentioned he was told by an employee that the four day work week resulted in days that were too long. He also stated that he believes the holidays that fall on Mondays allow the public availability only three days in that week if the weeks are kept at four days. Member Flynn said that the employees were not given the choice on the four day work week a couple of years ago and that they were made to change their schedules, and have now become comfortable with it. Chairman Poillucci stated that the Selectmen set the hours of the building.

Upon motion made by Member Garvey and seconded by Member Flynn, the Board

VOTED: To remain on a four day work week. Board Members Garvey and Flynn voted in favor. Chairman Poillucci was opposed.

Vendor Warrants were signed by the Board Members.

VOTED: To adjourn the meeting at 6:10 p.m. Unanimous vote in favor.
