

**Board of Health Meeting
June 24, 2009**

On June 24, 2009, the Board of Health held a Joint Meeting with the Board of Selectmen at 6:00 p.m. in the Board of Health Office. Present at this meeting were Selectmen Nancy Yeatts and Selectmen Chairman Derek Maksy. Also present were Board of Health Members Jennifer Turcotte and Terrence Flynn and Board of Health Supervisor, Nancy M. Teser, as recording secretary. Health Agent Lawrence Perry was absent from this meeting.

Member Yeatts called the Board of Selectmen meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. and Member Turcotte called the Board of Health meeting to order at 6:06 p.m.

Selectman Yeatts made a motion to appoint William E. Garvey, Jr. to the Board of Health, until the next annual election; which is scheduled for April 5, 2010, and Selectmen Chairman Maksy seconded the motion. The roll call vote was as follow: Yeatts, Aye; Masky, Aye; Turcotte, Aye; Flynn, Aye. William E. Garvey was welcomed to the Board.

Health Board Member Turcotte then made a motion to reappoint William E. Garvey, Jr. as Chairman of the Board of Health. The motion was seconded by Member Flynn. Unanimous vote.

At 6:10 p.m., Selectmen Yeatts voted to adjourn the Board of Selectmen meeting, the motion was seconded by Chairmen Maksy, and it was unanimous in favor.

Board of Health Member Turcotte then made a motion to reappoint Lawrence Perry as the Board of Health Agent and Inspector of Milk. The motion was seconded by Member Flynn and it was a unanimous vote.

Board Member Turcotte made a motion to reappoint David G. Goodfellow as Board of Health Agent. The motion was second by Board Member Flynn and it was a unanimous vote.

Board Member Turcotte made a motion to reappoint William E. Garvey, Jr. as Assistant Board of Health Agent. The motion was seconded by Member Flynn, and so voted. Garvey abstained from this vote.

Board Member Flynn made a motion to reappoint Jennifer Turcotte as Assistant Board of Health Agent. The motion was seconded by Chairman Garvey, and so voted. Turcotte abstained from this vote.

Board Member Turcotte made a motion to reappoint Terrence Flynn as Assistant Board of Health Agent. The motion was seconded by Chairman Garvey, and so voted. Flynn abstained from this vote.

On motion made by Turcotte, and seconded by Flynn, it was voted to approve the renewal of the Milk & Cream Licenses for Aramark Educational Services, LLC at the

Apponequet High School; George Austin Intermediate School and the Freetown-Lakeville Middle School. Unanimous vote.

Board Member Turcotte said she had to leave the meeting at 6:15 p.m. to attend another meeting and turned the meeting over to Chairman Garvey.

Chairman Garvey told Board Member Flynn that he would like to have the office open earlier on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday (7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) and closed on Fridays due to budget cuts at this time.

Kevin Walker, along with **Roger B. and Carol A. Stewart** of **59 Pierce Avenue (007-002-001)** met with the Board relative to a request for an out-of-season percolation test. Walker said they did unofficial testing at the site last week and they not only revealed good material, but also revealed no mottling at this site. Chairman Garvey told Walker they never granted any out of season percolation testing before. Walker stated that the entire site was over forty (40) acres, and that Mr. Stewart wanted to break a lot off of it for his daughter; whereas she's pregnant. Roger Stewart said he didn't know his daughter was pregnant before. Carol Stewart said she didn't know there was a percolation season, but they were all living in a tiny cottage right now and the baby was due in December. She said they've lived in this town for over thirty (30) years now, and that the bank rates were really down now. Garvey told them that it was still an out-of-season percolation test, it would open a Pandora Box, and he wouldn't vote for it. Board member Flynn agreed with him. No vote was taken at this time.

Vendor warrants were signed by the Board.

At 6:45 p.m. Board member Flynn made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Garvey. Unanimous vote.
