As they found no compelling reason to preserve the property we will send a memo to the Selectmen regretting the loss of a portion of the town's fields and forests but suggesting they waive the Town's right of first refusal on this Chapter 61 property.

Mike reported that she talked with Kelly Whitmore again about a Hilltop Farm event. Kelly is not at all enthusiastic about any sort of event now, but might be much further down the road, especially if we combined it with something else to draw a larger audience.

Linda has worked on updating the list of the Town's Chapter 61 lands and has created a map with the Chapter 61 plots colored in. She has been working with Molly at the Assessors' Office. The Committee needs now to study the map and visit the areas around town where these plots are in order to prioritize their value as open space.

As time is limited tonight we will discuss the open space by-law next time.
There are funds available for local technical assistance. Linda thought the Regional Open Space Committee might be interested in order to update the regional plan, but has not found much interest in doing so.
