Dear Ari and Katie.

I am writing to follow-up on my opinion below relative to the request for special town meeting.

The petition for the special town meeting states that it is for the purpose of asking the voters to approve a bylaw establishing a recall procedure for elected officials. As stated below, it is my opinion that such a bylaw, if passed, will have no legal effect.

In my opinion, the proposal in the petition must be inserted into the warrant exactly in the form of the petition; meaning that the Select Board does not have the authority to correct the petition prior to execution of the warrant. Likewise, once a petition is certified with the required number of signatures, it cannot be amended or withdrawn. A petitioned article is, however, subject to changes within the scope of the original article either by motion or by amendment made at Town Meeting. Whether such a change is acceptable is a matter within the discretion of the Moderator.

Some Massachusetts municipalities have established recall procedures by special act of the Legislature. Such a special act must first be approved by the voters at Town Meeting and then enacted by the Legislature. Although a petition for a special act to adopt a recall procedure for the Town may be brought to Town Meeting by petition, the proposed warrant article does not include a request for special legislation, and it cannot reasonably be interpreted as including such a request because it does not comply with the requirements of Chapter II, Section 18 of the Town's General Bylaws, which states that:

By a recent bylaw amendment, no article appearing on a warrant for an Annual or Special Town Meeting, requesting a petition to the General Court to enact special legislation shall be in order for consideration by Town Meeting unless the text of the special legislation sought is included as part of the article or as an appendix to the warrant, or is on file with the Town Clerk at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of a Special Town Meeting and seven (7) days prior to the date of an Annual Town Meeting at which it will be considered.

Therefore, because the Town does not have the authority to enact a bylaw establishing a recall procedure without also having a special act of the Legislature, and because the petitioned article does not include such a request for special legislation, it is my opinion that even if Town Meeting acts favorably on the petitioned article as written, the action will be unlawful and of no effect.

Dear Ari:

As we discussed, the Select Board is required to call a special town meeting upon receipt of a petition signed by at least 200 registered voters of the Town. G.L. c. 39, §10. Said meeting must be held within forty-five days of receipt of the petition and it must be called by a warrant signed by the Select Board and posted at least fourteen days prior to the meeting. Id.

The warrant must include the subject-matter of the petition in the exact wording used by the petitioner. Otherwise, the Town Meeting may proceed as any other town meeting, which means that there must be a quorum present to transact business, there must be a motion and a second on the article, and the main motion is subject to amendment and debate. In my opinion, the Select Board has the authority to also include in the warrant any other articles as it sees fit.

Please note that, although the Select Board is required to hold the requested Town Meeting, it is my opinion that the request set forth in the proposed warrant will have no legal effect if passed. Municipalities have no power to remove elected officials from office unless such an action is authorized by a state statute. Turner v. City of Boston, 462 Mass. 511, 516 (2012). There is no provision in the General Laws that allows for the recall of local elected officials and I have been informed that the Town of Lakeville does not have a special act of the Legislature authorizing such action. Therefore, it is my opinion that if Town Meeting acts favorably on the petitioned article, the action will be unlawful and of no effect.

Hi Ari.

In my opinion, there are no restrictions as to repetitive petitions to Town Meeting on any question, including the question of whether to implement a recall procedure. The only limitation that I am aware of is in G.L. c. 40A, §5, which only applies to zoning bylaw amendments and which prohibits consideration of a zoning bylaw amendment that was unfavorably acted on within two years of the unfavorable action unless the matter receives a positive recommendation of the planning board.

Recall of an Elected Official

A. RECALL DESCRIPTION

1. Any holder of an elected office in the Town of Lakeville may be recalled therefrom by registered voters of the Town as hereinafter provided.

- 2. The recall of an elected official will consist of a 3-step process.
- 3. An initial recall affidavit shall not be filed against an officer within 3 months after the officer takes office or within the last 3 months of the term.

B. INITIATION OF THE RECALL AFFADAVIT - (Step one) The Affidavit

- 1. Any 100 registered voters of the Town of Lakeville may initiate a recall petition by filing an affidavit with the Town Clerk.
- 2. The Select Board may appoint a Temporary/ Interim Town Clerk to handle the recall process and Election should the Town Clerk be the Elected official subjected to the recall.

C. THE PETITION - (Step two) The Petition

- 1. If the affidavit process has been completed in compliance with the requirements of Section B of this Chapter, the Town Clerk shall provide a sufficient number of copies of petition blanks demanding such recall (printed forms of which shall be kept on hand) to the voters who made the affidavit. The blanks shall be issued by the Town Clerk and bear the Clerk's signature and Official Seal; they shall be dated and addressed to the Select Board and shall contain the names of all persons to whom issued, the number of blanks so issued, the name of the person sought to be recalled, and shall demand the election of a successor to such office.
- 2. Such blanks must be provided within five Town hall business days during regular business hours.
- 3. Said recall petition shall be returned and filed with the Town Clerk on the 28th day after the requesting voter receives the blank petitions from the Town Clerk.
- 4. In the event that the Town hall is not open on the 28th day, the petition may be filed during normal business hours on the next Town hall business day.
- 5. The petition, before being returned and filed, shall be signed by 200 qualified voters of the Town. Every signature must be accompanied by the signer's place of residence, giving the street and number.
- 6. Within 5 working days of receipt of the recall petition sheets, the town clerk shall submit the recall petition sheets to the board of registrars of voters and the board of registrars of voters shall verify the number of signatures which are names of registered voters of the town.

D. THE RECALL ELECTION - (Step three) The Recall Election

1. If the petition shall be found and certified by the Registrars of Voters to be sufficient, the Town Clerk shall forthwith submit it with the certificate to the Select Board. The Select Board

shall forthwith give written notice to said official of the receipt of said ce**SELECTMEN'S OFFICE** official sought to be removed does not resign within seven calendar days, shall order an election to be held on a day fixed by them not less than 45 days nor more than 60 days after the date of the Town Clerk's certificate that a sufficient petition is filed. However, if any other Town election is to occur within 90 days after the date of said certificate the Select Board may, at their discretion, postpone the holding of the recall election to the date of such other election. If a vacancy occurs in said office after a recall election has been so ordered, the election shall nevertheless proceed as in this section provided.

- 2. The nomination of other candidates, the publication of the warrant for the recall election and the conduct of the nomination and publication, shall all be in accordance with the law relating to elections, unless otherwise provided in this act.
- 3. Ballots used in a recall election shall contain the following propositions:

[NAME OF OFFICER] ()

AGAINST THE RECALL OF THE

[NAME OF OFFICER] ()

Adjacent to each proposition, there shall be a place to mark a vote. Following the propositions shall appear the word "Candidates" with directions to voters as required by section 42 of chapter 54 of the General Laws. Beneath the word "Candidates" shall appear the names of candidates nominated as provided in this act. Adjacent to the name of each candidate shall be a place to mark a vote.

F. DUTIES OF THE INCUMBENT

- 1. The incumbent shall continue to perform the duties of his/her office until the recall election.
- 2. If the official is not recalled, he/she shall continue in the office for the remainder of his/her unexpired term, subject to recall as before, as provided in this act.

H. VOTING RESULTS

- 1. If a majority of the votes cast upon the question of recall are in favor of recall, the officer shall be recalled and the votes for the candidates shall be counted.
- 2. In that instance, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected for the open office.
- 3. If less than a majority of the votes cast are in favor of recall, the votes for candidates shall not be counted.
- 4. If the official is recalled in the recall election, he/she shall be deemed removed upon the election of his/her successor, who shall hold office during the unexpired term.

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING PETITION -RECALL OF AN ELECTED OFFICIAL

5. If the successor fails to take office within five days after receiving notification of his/her election, the incumbent shall thereupon be deemed removed and the office vacant.

I. CANDIDATES TO SUCCEED THE ELECTED OFFICIAL

- 1. Any elected official sought to be recalled may not be a candidate to succeed himself/herself.
- 2. The nomination of candidates, the publication of the warrant for the recall election, and the conduct of the same shall all be in accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections unless otherwise provided by this act.

J. APPOINTMENT OF RECALLED OR RESIGNED OFFICIAL

- 1. Any person who has been removed from an office or who has resigned from office while recall proceedings were pending against him/her shall not be appointed to any Town office within 4 years after such removal or such resignation.
- 2. In the case of an officer subjected to a recall election and not recalled, a new recall affidavit shall not be filed against that officer until at least 3 months have elapsed after the election at which the previous recall was submitted to the voters of the town.

K. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall take effect upon its passage.

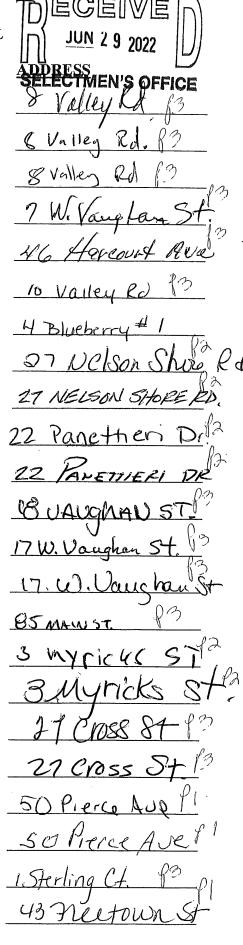

Greetings:

In the name of the Commonwealth, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town who are qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet in the

APPONEQUET REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL GYMNASIUM 100 HOWLAND ROAD, LAKEVILLE, MA

On Monday, August 8, 2022, at 6:30 PM, then and there to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1: To see if the Town will vote to amend the General By-laws of Town of Lakeville by adding the attached By-law for the Recall of an Elected Official or take any action thereto.

BY PETITION

Recall of an Elected Official

A. RECALL DESCRIPTION

- 1. Any holder of an elected office in the Town of Lakeville may be recalled therefrom by registered voters of the Town as hereinafter provided.
- 2. The recall of an elected official will consist of a 3-step process.
- 3. An initial recall affidavit shall not be filed against an officer within 3 months after the officer takes office or within the last 3 months of the term.
- B. INITIATION OF THE RECALL AFFADAVIT (Step one) The Affidavit
- 1. Any 100 registered voters of the Town of Lakeville may initiate a recall petition by filing an affidavit with the Town Clerk.

2. The Select Board may appoint a Temporary/ Interim Town Clerk to handle the recall process and Election should the Town Clerk be the Elected official subjected to the recall.

C. THE PETITION - (Step two) The Petition

- 1. If the affidavit process has been completed in compliance with the requirements of Section B of this Chapter, the Town Clerk shall provide a sufficient number of copies of petition blanks demanding such recall (printed forms of which shall be kept on hand) to the voters who made the affidavit. The blanks shall be issued by the Town Clerk and bear the Clerk's signature and Official Seal; they shall be dated and addressed to the Select Board and shall contain the names of all persons to whom issued, the number of blanks so issued, the name of the person sought to be recalled, and shall demand the election of a successor to such office.
- 2. Such blanks must be provided within five Town hall business days during regular business hours.
- 3. Said recall petition shall be returned and filed with the Town Clerk on the 28th day after the requesting voter receives the blank petitions from the Town Clerk.
- 4. In the event that the Town hall is not open on the 28th day, the petition may be filed during normal business hours on the next Town hall business day.
- 5. The petition, before being returned and filed, shall be signed by 200 qualified voters of the Town. Every signature must be accompanied by the signer's place of residence, giving the street and number.
- 6. Within 5 working days of receipt of the recall petition sheets, the town clerk shall submit the recall petition sheets to the board of registrars of voters and the board of registrars of voters shall verify the number of signatures which are names of registered voters of the town.

D. THE RECALL ELECTION - (Step three) The Recall Election

1. If the petition shall be found and certified by the Registrars of Voters to be sufficient, the Town Clerk shall forthwith submit it with the certificate to the Select Board. The Select Board shall forthwith give written notice to said official of the receipt of said certificate and, if the official sought to be removed does not resign within seven calendar days, shall order an election to be held on a day fixed by them not less than 45 days nor more than 60 days after the date of the Town Clerk's certificate that a sufficient petition is filed. However, if any other Town election is

to occur within 90 days after the date of said certificate the Select Board may, at their discretion, postpone the holding of the recall election to the date of such other election. If a vacancy occurs in said office after a recall election has been so ordered, the election shall nevertheless proceed as in this section provided.

- 2. The nomination of other candidates, the publication of the warrant for the recall election and the conduct of the nomination and publication, shall all be in accordance with the law relating to elections, unless otherwise provided in this act.
- 3. Ballots used in a recall election shall contain the following propositions:

FOR THE RECALL OF THE [NAME OF OFFICER] ()

AGAINST THE RECALL OF THE [NAME OF OFFICER] ()

Adjacent to each proposition, there shall be a place to mark a vote. Following the propositions shall appear the word "Candidates" with directions to voters as required by section 42 of chapter 54 of the General Laws. Beneath the word "Candidates" shall appear the names of candidates nominated as provided in this act. Adjacent to the name of each candidate shall be a place to mark a vote.

F. DUTIES OF THE INCUMBENT

- 1. The incumbent shall continue to perform the duties of his/her office until the recall election.
- 2. If the official is not recalled, he/she shall continue in the office for the remainder of his/her unexpired term, subject to recall as before, as provided in this act.

H. VOTING RESULTS

- 1. If a majority of the votes cast upon the question of recall are in favor of recall, the officer shall be recalled and the votes for the candidates shall be counted.
- 2. In that instance, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected for the open office.
- 3. If less than a majority of the votes cast are in favor of recall, the votes for candidates shall not be counted.

- 4. If the official is recalled in the recall election, he/she shall be deemed removed upon the election of his/her successor, who shall hold office during the unexpired term.
- 5. If the successor fails to take office within five days after receiving notification of his/her election, the incumbent shall thereupon be deemed removed and the office vacant.

I. CANDIDATES TO SUCCEED THE ELECTED OFFICIAL

- 1. Any elected official sought to be recalled may not be a candidate to succeed himself/herself.
- 2. The nomination of candidates, the publication of the warrant for the recall election, and the conduct of the same shall all be in accordance with the provisions of law relating to elections unless otherwise provided by this act.

J. APPOINTMENT OF RECALLED OR RESIGNED OFFICIAL

- 1. Any person who has been removed from an office or who has resigned from office while recall proceedings were pending against him/her shall not be appointed to any Town office within 4 years after such removal or such resignation.
- 2. In the case of an officer subjected to a recall election and not recalled, a new recall affidavit shall not be filed against that officer until at least 3 months have elapsed after the election at which the previous recall was submitted to the voters of the town.

K. EFFECTIVE DATE

This act shall take effect upon its passage.

You are directed to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy hereof fourteen days at least before the day appointed for a Special Town Meeting and seven days at least before the day appointed for the Annual Town Meeting at the following places: Town Office Building, Baldie's Pizzeria, Fat Cousins, the Clark Shores Association Bulletin Board, Apponequet Regional High School, Lakeville Senior Center, and Assawompset Elementary School.

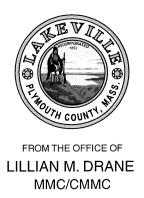

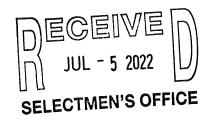

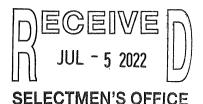

Chapter 88

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE DEPARTMENT OF INSPECTIONAL SERVICES AND PERMITTING IN THE TOWN OF LAKEVILLE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. (a) There shall be a department of inspectional services and permitting in the town of Lakeville. The department shall:

- (i) coordinate the inspection and permitting functions carried out by officers and employees under this act;
- (ii) maintain the records relating to inspections and permitting in a central place;
- (iii) coordinate enforcement actions for violations of the General Laws, the state building code, local general and zoning by-laws and the rules and regulations that are subject to enforcement by officers and employees of the town under this act;
- (iv) render advice, assistance and guidance to town offices and agencies in matters relating to town inspection and permitting services;
 - (v) render advice, assistance and guidance to members of the

public in matters relating to town inspection and permitting services and develop user-friendly systems for the convenience of the public; and

- (vi) perform other functions expressly delegated by the board of selectmen, conservation commission or board of health that the director of inspectional services and permitting has agreed to assume.
- (b) The inspection and permitting services performed by or under the authority of the building inspector, board of health, inspector of gas piping and gas appliances, plumbing inspector, electrical inspector, zoning enforcement officer, conservation commission or any other local inspection that may be authorized by vote of the board of selectmen shall be coordinated through the department of inspectional services and permitting.
- (c) There shall be a director of inspectional services and permitting who shall be the executive and administrative head of the department. The director shall be appointed by the board of selectmen and may be removed at the board's pleasure; provided, however, that the appointment shall be subject to the requirements for the appointment of an inspector of buildings or building commissioner under chapter 143 of the General Laws. The director shall possess the necessary qualifications, experience and certification required for an inspector of buildings or building commissioner pursuant to section 3 of said chapter 143.
 - (d) The director of inspectional services and permitting shall:
- (i) establish a full and complete inventory of the inspection and permitting services performed by an officer of the town under this act;
- (ii) establish common files by property address, reference to a map, block or lot reference or both that shall be accessible to a person

performing inspection and permitting services for the town and contain recordings of the inspections performed by an officer or employee under this act;

- (iii) provide common services for personnel who perform inspection and permitting services and a centralized location for members of the public to obtain information concerning inspection and permitting services; provided, however, that the director of inspectional services and permitting shall be available to members of the public in order to assist them under this act;
- (iv) serve as facilities manager for town buildings unless a separate facilities manager is designated by the board of selectmen;
- (v) supervise, direct and manage personnel appointed or hired to perform inspection or permitting services under this act; and
- (vi) supervise, direct and manage personnel appointed or hired to perform other permitting functions of the town, upon the request of a board, committee or commission with permitting authority, subject to the approval of the board of selectmen and the agreement of the director.
- (e) The director of inspectional services and permitting may also serve as the building commissioner or inspector, the zoning enforcement officer or both; provided, however, that if the director is designated by the board of selectmen as the building commissioner or inspector, the zoning enforcement officer or both, the person holding the positions shall be considered to hold a single town position.
- SECTION 2. An officer, employee, committee, commission, board or department in the town of Lakeville who is performing inspection or permitting functions outside of the scope of this act shall continue to perform those functions, unless the committee, commission, board

or department responsible for the functions votes to delegate the functions to the department of inspectional services and permitting and such delegation shall be approved by the board of selectmen in consultation with the director of inspectional services and permitting.

SECTION 3. All books, papers, documents, equipment, land and other property that is in the custody and control of an officer, employee, committee, commission, board or department affected by the consolidation under this act shall be transferred to the department of inspectional services and permitting, as necessary. A contract in force shall be continued in force until it expires or is otherwise cancelled. A judicial proceeding in which an officer, employee, committee, commission, board or department affected by the consolidation is a party shall not be affected by the consolidation.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the board of selectmen of the town of Lakeville shall appoint, and may remove at its pleasure, any necessary gas, plumbing and electrical inspectors; provided, however, that such gas, plumbing and electrical inspectors shall possess the necessary qualifications, experience and certifications required under the General Laws.

SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the board of selectmen of the town of Lakeville shall be the appointing authority for the personnel necessary to implement, execute and enforce the health laws and the regulations of the board of health including, but not limited to, the state sanitary code and section 40 of chapter 131 of the General Laws, local wetlands protection bylaws and the regulations of the department of environmental protection and the conservation commission. The board may fix the salaries or other compensation of such personnel, subject to an

applicable collective bargaining agreement. Nothing in this section shall affect the obligations, rights and responsibilities imposed pursuant to chapter 150E of the General Laws insofar as applicable. SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Description:

Provide clerical support to the Building Commissioner/Director of Inspectional Services and Permitting/Facilities Director, and various boards and commissions as needed. Provide a wide and diverse variety of clerical duties to assist the Building Commissioner/Director of Inspectional Services and Permitting/Facilities Manager and various boards and commissions on an as-needed basis as determined by the supervisors, depending upon departmental needs. Fully cross-trained to support and provide coverage for all other clerical positions in the Department.

Essential Functions:
