## ANNUAL TOWN ELECTION APRIL 4, 2022

The Annual Election of the Town of Lakeville was held at the Ted Williams Camp, Loon Pond Lodge, 28 Precinct Street in accordance with the warrant issued by the Selectmen and properly posted by a constable of the Town.

Specimen ballots, penalty and instruction cards were posted in accordance with the law. The ballot boxes were inspected, found to be empty, and registers were set at zero and posted. All election officers were sworn to the faithful performance of their duties.

The polls were declared open at 12:00 PM and closed at 8:00 PM in accordance with the Warrant. There were 1417 ballots cast, including 57 absentees. Precinct One had 428 ballots, Precinct Two had 537 ballots and Precinct Three had 452 ballots. Preliminary totals were announced, then all ballots were checked for write-ins and there were three (3) ballots that had to be hand counted. The final results are as follows:

## **QUESTION 1: Community Preservation Act**

TOWN CLERK for 3 yrs

"Sections 3 to 7 of Chapter 44B of the General Laws of Massachusetts, also known as the **Community Preservation Act** (Act), establishes a dedicated funding source to enable the Town to:

- (1) acquire, create and preserve open space;
- (2) acquire, preserve, rehabilitate and restore historic resources;
- (3) acquire, create, preserve, rehabilitate and restore land for recreational use;
- (4) acquire, create, preserve and support community housing; and
- (5) rehabilitate or restore open space and

community housing that is acquired or created with Community Preservation Funds.

In LAKEVILLE, the funding source for these community preservation purposes will be a surcharge of 1% on the annual property tax assessed on real property and any matching funds provided by the state from a trust fund created by the Act. If approved, the Act will take effect on July 1, 2022 and the following will be exempt from the surcharge:

- property owned and occupied as a domicile by any person who qualifies for low income housing or low or moderate income senior housing;
- (2) \$100,000 of the value of each taxable parcel of residential real property; and
- (3) \$100,000 of the value of each taxable parcel of class three, commercial property, and class four, industrial property as defined in section 2A of said chapter 59.

A taxpayer receiving a regular property tax abatement or exemption will also receive a pro rata reduction in surcharge. A Community Preservation Committee will be established by Town of Lakeville General Bylaws to study community preservation resources, possibilities and needs and to make annual recommendations to town meeting on spending the funds.

## NOTE: New Procedure to Check-In at the Annual Town Election

To accelerate the check-in process at Lakeville's Annual Town Election this year, check-in will now be accomplished by use of electronic Poll Pads. The use of these tablets will allow our election officers to check in a voter:

- 1. By manually entering the first three (3) letters of the voter's first and last name; or
- 2. By scanning the bar code on the back of the voter's driver's license. In this case, the Poll Pad matches the name and birth date of the person on the voter list with the name and birth date it reads from the bar code on the back of the license. No information from the scanned license is retained by the Poll Pad. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts does not require that a voter present a license to check in at any Elections and Town Meetings.

The Poll Pads immediately talk to one another, eliminating any chance of a voter checking in more than once.
