PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION March 5, 2024

The Presidential Primary Election was held at the Ted Williams Camp, Loon Pond Lodge, 28 Precinct Street, on March 5, 2024 in accordance with the warrant issued by the Select Board and properly posted by a constable of the Town.

Specimen ballots, penalty and instruction cards were posted in accordance with the law. The ballot boxes were inspected, found to be empty, and registers were set at zero. All election officers were sworn to the faithful performance of their duties.

The polls were declared open at 7:00 AM and closed at 8:00 PM in accordance with the Warrant. There were **2,836 BALLOTS CAST**, which includes <u>8</u> Absentee ballots, <u>1147</u> Early Voting ballots, <u>0</u> UOCAVA, <u>1</u> Provisional's. **Precinct One** had <u>891 ballots</u> (Democrats 305, Republicans 578, and Libertarian Party 8), **Precinct Two** had <u>1051 ballots</u> (Democrats 347, Republicans 690, and Libertarian Party 14) and **Precinct Three** had <u>894 ballots</u> (Democrats 305, Republicans 576, and Libertarian Party 13). Preliminary totals were announced in the foyer, then all ballots were checked for write-ins and there were one (1) ballot that had to be hand counted.

It was around <u>1:00 AM</u> when I made the final call to Associated Press. The Final Results are as follows:

ADVANCE REMOVAL & DEPOSIT: In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 54 section 25B as amended by Section 10 of Chapter 92 of the Acts of 2022, the Town of Lakeville opened and/or deposited early voted ballots at Town Offices, 346 Bedford Street on <u>Saturday, March 2, 2024</u> <u>at 9:00 AM</u> and finished at 3:00 PM. Each precinct was tabulated separately and recorded accordingly.

A full record of advance removal and advance depositing was kept at this session. Per State requirements, all Vote by Mail Ballots received after advance processing session was processed at the polls on Election Day.

In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 54 section 25B as amended by Section 10 of Chapter 92 of the Acts of 2022, no results were determined or announced until after the time the polls closed on March 5th at 8:00 PM. At that time, the results from the advance processed ballots were combined with the Precincts Totals.

There were <u>926 BALLOTS CAST</u>, which includes <u>Precinct One</u> had 269 ballots (Democrats 135, Republicans 129, and Libertarian Party 5), <u>Precinct Two</u> had 362 ballots (Democrats 152, Republicans 204, and Libertarian Party 6) and <u>Precinct Three</u> had 295 ballots (Democrats 166, Republicans 128, and Libertarian Party 1).

EARLY VOTING: Early Voting took place at the Town House (Old Town Hall) 2 Precinct Street from Saturday, February 24th 9:00am-3:00pm; Monday, February 26th - Thursday, February 29th from 8:00am-4:30pm and Friday, March 1st from 8:00am- Noon.

NOTE: New Procedure to Check-In at the Presidential Primary Election and Early Voting Session

To accelerate the check-in process at the Presidential Primary Election this year, check-in was accomplished by the use of electronic Poll Pads. The use of these tablets allowed our election officers to check in a voter:

- 1. By manually entering the first three (3) letters of the voter's first and last name; or
- 2. By scanning the bar code on the back of the voter's driver's license. In this case, the Poll Pad matches the name and birth date of the person on the voter list with the name and birth date it reads from the bar code on the back of the license. <u>No information from the</u> <u>scanned license is retained by the Poll Pad</u>. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts does not require that a voter present a license to check in at any Elections and Town Meetings.

The Poll Pads immediately talk to one another, eliminating any chance of a voter checking in more than once.
