

Project Area








- Intersection & Corridor Safety
- Deficient Bicycle Accommodation
- Deficient Pedestrian Accommodation
- Pavement Deterioration
- Stormwater Collection





- Corridor Crash Rate = 3.14 (Statewide Avg = 3.8)
- Rt 79/18 Crash Rate = 1.24 (Statewide Avg = 0.78)
- Rt 79/Precinct Crash Rate = 0.56 (Statewide Avg = 0.57)
































Project Goals

- Intersection Safety
 - Improve Intersection Safety
 - Improve Corridor Safety
- Deficient Bicycle Accommodation
 - Incorporate Bicycle Accommodation Into Typical Section
- Pedestrian Accommodation
 - New Sidewalks/Curb Ramps & Crosswalks to ADA/AAB Standards
- Horizontal & Vertical Geometry
 - Incorporate Improvements to Roadway Curvature, Sight Distance and Roadway Profile
- Pavement Deterioration
 - New Roadway Pavement (Milling & Overlay, Reclamation)
- Stormwater Collection
 - Reduce Erosion and Roadway Flooding, Improve Water Quality Treatment






Project Scope

- Widened cross section consisting of 2 lanes and shoulders suitable for bicycle accommodation (32' cross section vs 22-24' exist.)
- ADA/AAB compliant sidewalk and curb ramps on one side of road
- Pavement resurfacing and full depth construction
- Intersection improvements at Precinct St and Route 18 intersections
 - Reconstruct traffic signal at Route 18
- New regulatory and warning traffic signs and pavement markings
- Horizontal and vertical sight distance improvements
- Stormwater improvements
 - Closed drainage system and water quality treatment








RHODE ISLAND ROAD (ROUTE 79)

STA 33+74± TO 50+00± (PRECINCT STREET TO WATER STREET)







Right of Way

- Approximately 110 properties affected
- 6 takings totaling approximately 8,500 SF
- 30 permanent easements totaling approximately 60,000 SF
- 115 temporary easements totaling approximately 4 acres



Town of Lakeville Additional Costs

- Design and Survey Services
- Permanent Easement Acquisitions
- Temporary Easement Acquisitions
- Appraisal Fees
- Legal Fees

Total Approximately \$2.3 Million





Project Cost

•	Initial Design Services (Already paid by Town)
	Construction Costs (Federal/State share of project)
<u>\$2.3 M</u>	Town Share of the Project
\$12,825,000	Total

Federal Highway and State pay 100% of construction cost





Cost per Household

Value		Total
\$100K	\$11.09 per year for 15 years	\$166.35
\$200K	\$22.18 per year for 15 years	\$332.70
\$400K	\$44.36 per year for 15 years	\$665.40





Why Do This Project?

- Federal Highway and State are paying for 100% of construction cost
- If we don't, the cost of the project will be 5 to 6 Million without sidewalks and no reimbursement from the State
- It will only cost the Town \$2.3 Million
- Will lose grant money
